- Present a minimum cumulative average of 85%.
- Hold Canadian citizenship or permanent resident status.
- Be at least 16 years of age by September 1st of the following year.

TD Scholarship for Community Leadership

The [TD Scholarship for Community Leadership](#) awards students up to \$70,000 for college or university (up to \$10,000 for tuition per year, \$7,500 a year for living expenses) for 4 years.

It's open to students across Canada who:

- Have demonstrated community leadership
- Are in final year of high school
- Have a minimum overall grade average of 75% in their most recently completed school year

If this is something you're excited about, then you should look out for applications starting in September. But here is the general process:

- **1. Write a 600-word essay (three copies) describing your community leadership experience.**
 - Why you got involved
 - How your involvement shows initiative and innovation
 - The ways your efforts have strengthened others
 - How long you have been involved
 - What you think the long-term impact will be
 - How your community has affected you

TD Scholarship for Community Leadership Continued

- **2. Tell us about the other great things you're doing. Include a brief description of the range of your other community activities with:**
 - A letter of recommendation from your school
 - Two letters of support from community groups
 - Your academic transcript
- **3. If you're really trying to impress, you also have the option of including:**
 - A 250-word essay (three copies) describing your family and personal life, for example your family's employment or economic situation
 - A 250-word essay about your life experiences if you have taken a year or more away from high school

G3 Grow Beyond Scholarship

- Eligible applicants must be:
 - Attending a Canadian high school
 - Graduating this year
 - Planning to enroll at a Canadian post-secondary institution in a first-year degree or diploma program
- Applicants will be assessed on the following:
 - Video essay: Video submissions will be judged by a panel of industry professionals (50% weighting)
 - Public voting: Via online voting, maximum one video vote will be allowed per region (5 votes maximum). (25% weighting)
 - Community and/or school involvement (25% weighting)
 - Details to be provided within the submission form

STEAM Horizon Awards

- Developed for Canada's youth to promote positive changes throughout their community using science, technology, engineering, arts, and math (STEAM).
- Five Canadian students will be awarded \$25,000 each, to attend a Canadian university, college or CEGEP to study in a STEAM field.

ELIGIBILITY

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

1. A completed application form
2. A written essay
 - The essay should discuss the applicant's vision for the future of Manitoba, and answer the question, "If you were elected Premier of Manitoba, what would you do?"

Additional essay requirements: 1000 word maximum, word processed, double spaced, 12-point font (Arial or Times New Roman)

MARK DICKOF MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

To be considered for the award, a student (or students) must:

- Be between the ages of 14 and 18 and enrolled in a public school in Manitoba
- Complete an essay of no longer than 500 words. The essay should outline how the applicant or applicants have engaged in actions, raised awareness, or fostered greater sensitivity and/or de-stigmatization in relation to mental health and wellbeing.

- Deadline middle of May

RCMP Troop 17 Scholarship

Eligibility criteria

To be considered for the Troop 17 Scholarship, all applicants must:

- be a Canadian citizen/permanent resident who has reached the age of majority in their province/territory of residence
- be enrolled in a full-time accredited Canadian college or university
- demonstrate they have made significant efforts in preventing bullying & harassment in their schools &/or communities
- explain how they continue to promote anti-harassment principles in their schools and/or communities

- Plans to attend an accredited postsecondary educational institution in the United States or Canada, full-time or part-time, in the fall of the academic year following high school graduation
- Is recommended by and receives the vote of a local P.E.O. chapter
