Graduation Requirements & Honour Roll

- Provincial Diploma = 30 credits from High School
- <u>Vocational Diploma</u> = 30 credits, including specific vocational program requirements (usually a minimum of 8 credits in vocational area of study)
- Provincial Diploma with Distinction = 32 credits (or more)
- Honour Roll Requirements:
 - 80% Average (or higher) in subjects including English 40S, Math 40S, Phys. Ed 40F, as well as 4 additional 40S credits (with marks).
 - Credits for Employment, Volunteer Credit etc. and other credits that are Pass/Fail cannot be used towards Honour Roll.
 - Note: MAP40S counts for Math 40S and one other 40S course.



Health Care Aide/Red River College Partnership - See Mr. Hordeski

- Great introduction for those considering a career in almost any area of health care
- Second semester
- Offered to Grade 12 students that have met high school core graduation requirements
- Students earn Health Care Aide Certificate valid across most of Canada
- ► Can be used as a laddering opportunity in nursing/medicine
- Five Grade 12 credits

High School Apprenticeship Program -

High School Apprenticeship Program - See Mr. Hordeski

- Program that allows students to begin collecting apprenticeship hours while still in high school
- Skilled trades based (carpentry, electrical, roofing, plumbing, ag technician, automotive technician, hairstyling, millright, many more)
- Paid salary
- Up to 8 credits towards high school graduation
- ► Homework is getting a job with someone that will apprentice you
- If you are not able to participate in the High School Apprenticeship program, but are interested in a career in the skilled trades after high school, please see Mr. Hordeski for further information.

Credits For Employment - See Mr. Hordeski

- Viable option for students short of credits, but currently employed.
- Able to earn up to two credits towards high school graduation (one at the grade 11 level, and one at the grade 12 level
- Does not come with a mark/complete/incomplete
- Requires Career Development pre-requisite
- ► Connect with Mr. Hordeski in order to learn more, including how to earn the Career Development pre-requisite (if you do not already have it)

Educational Assistant Training See Mr. Hordeski

- New program offering
- Involves 6 half-day training sessions second semester
- All participants will earn Portage School Division Intro to Educational Assistant Certificate
- Who is this for? Students taking a gap-year next year/students with teaching aspirations/students that would like to be an EA
- Phase one is the certification
- ► Phase two is actual employment next year with the Portage School Division as an educational assistant / priority given to Indigenous students
- ► Talk to me immediately after this assembly to secure a spot in the training

PLANNING FOR AFTER HIGH SCHOOL

- ►GAP year a year-long break between high school graduation and postsecondary (still eligible for many S & B)
- Directly transfer into the world of work
- Move directly into post-secondary education (apply to S & B)

POST-SECONDARY TIME-LINE SEMESTER 1

- RESEARCH DOLOGY IMPACTOR AND ADDRESS AND A
- You need to begin to start doing some research on your own.
- Check-out post-secondary information like Open Houses or tours that pertain to you (see PCI website)
- Meet with Ms. Bousquet to explore post-secondary options and to make sure that all of your high school requirements are met in order to apply for your desired program and for Entrance Scholarships

Please Note: There are specific requirements for entrance scholarships and they differ depending on the institution -

Grade 12 Graduation vs. Post-Secondary vs. Honour Roll Requirements vs. Entrance Scholarship Requirements

- Grad Requirements in Manitoba: English 40S, Math 40S, Phys Ed 40F and 2 other 40S courses
- Post-Secondary Requirements: English 40S, Math 40S, Phys Ed 40F and 3 other 40S courses (excluding Vocational Courses)
- ► Honour Roll Requirements: English 40S, Math 40S, Phys Ed 40F and 4 other 40S courses. Note: MAP40S counts for Math 40S and one other 40S course.
- ► Entrance Scholarships: post-secondary requirements plus specific eligible courses

Note: See Ms Bousquet in the Career Centre to check Entrance Scholarship requirements

U of M Entrance Scholarships Example

LAW40S & PSY40S CANNOT be used toward Entrance Scholarships but FDS40S and VAR40S can be used.

PCI Scholarships & Bursaries

- Over \$90, 000 and there are multiple ways to be eligible

Personal High School Portfolios

- It is important that you keep all of your important documents during your high school career, especially for Scholarship & Bursary Applications
- PCI will not be keeping track of this information for you.
- Some things to include in your Personal Portfolio:
 - Report cards
 - Resume
 - Academic awards
 - Sports awards/teams
 - Reference letters
 - Positive referrals
 - Thank you cards/letters
 - Community Involvement/Volunteering this is something you can be doing to prepare for PCI S & B applications

Note: myBlueprint is an excellent tool you can use to create and keep track of your Personal Portfolio. See Mrs. Bertholet or Ms Bousquet if you need help with this.

WHAT ARE YOUR RESPONSIBILITIES IN ALL OF THIS?

- ▶ If you haven't done any investigating Start researching now!
- ► Email Ms. Bousquet to request a meeting time to discuss postsecondary options and to ensure that you have the required high school pre-requisites for your desired program. The Career Centre is the best place to start for all "next steps"
- ► Check your Google Classroom notifications regularly

- Register for your desired post-secondary program BEFORE March 1st
