# Graduation Requirements

---

**Provincial Diploma** = 30 credits from High School

Students can earn a dual diploma – the Manitoba High School Diploma and a Vocational Diploma.

**Vocational Diploma** = 30 credits, including specific vocational program requirements

**French Immersion Diploma** = 30 credits, including specific vocational program requirements

**Provincial Diploma with Distinction** = completing Grade 12 with 32 credits or more

The focus should be on doing well, with a manageable course load



# Honour Roll

---

Students who have maintained an average of 80% or higher will be named to the school's Honour Roll. This achievement will be recognized at the Undergrad Awards Ceremony which is held in October.

# Honour Roll Requirements

Students who have maintained an 80% average will be named to the school's honour roll. The awards average is calculated as follows:

Grade	Core Subjects	# of Best Electives
9	5 core courses (Eng., Math, Soc., Sci. P.E.)	2 best electives (at Gr. 9 level)
10	5 core courses (Eng., Math, Sci., Geo., P.E.)	2 best electives (at Gr. 10 level)
11	4 core courses (Eng., Math, History, P.E.)	3 best electives (at Gr. 11 level)
12	3 core courses (Eng., Math, P.E.)	4 best electives (at Gr. 12 level)

**Note: Grade 12 Pre-Cal can count twice, as Math + one elective**

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



# Tech. Ed./Vocational Programming

## Level 1 & Professional Certification

If students wish to pursue Hairstyling, Automotive Technology or Building Construction even further, there are additional opportunities as noted below:

### **Automotive Level 1 Requirements:**

- 70% average obtained in 9 out of 10 courses
- Hours requirement met
- Recommendation of the instructor

### **Hairstyling Certification:**

- 70% average obtained in all 12 required courses
- Hours requirement met
- Certification exam

### **Building Construction Level 1 Requirements:**

- 70% average obtained in 9 courses
- Hours requirement met (900 hours)
- Additional 900 hours required through apprenticeship opportunity outside of school/classroom hours

## Courses

### Welcome to Portage Collegiate Institute!

We are a semestered high school offering a wide range of courses for Grade 9 to Grade 12 students. As a semestered high school, we divide the school year into two semesters. The first semester runs from September to January with final exams the last week of January. The second semester runs from February to June.

Under the semester system, students take fewer courses in a term but complete them in the same amount of time.

# Choosing Courses

## Important Information:

The number of sections of each class are decided by your selections (i.e. if only 18 students choose to take Visual Arts, there will only be one section of Visual Arts for the year.)

Let a PCI team member know if you cannot afford the fee for a course

It is important to make informed choices as you cannot change courses easily after the timetables are made

## Reasons to change your timetable:

- You have a course you did not choose
- Most of your courses that have a lot of homework are in the same semester
- You have a spare (this is not allowed in Grade 9)

## Not a reason to change your timetable:

- I don't like the class/teacher
- I changed my mind

# Credits from Outside Activities

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## **Eligible to be Used Toward Graduation:**

### **Royal Winnipeg Ballet (RWB):**

You can obtain credits if you are registered in the senior levels of the RWB professional program.

### **Special Language Credit Option:**

You can earn credits for mastery of a language other than English or French. This includes the American Sign Language credits. Special examinations are required.

## **Not Eligible to be Used Toward Graduation:**

### **Private Music Option:**

You can acquire music credits if you complete examinations with the Conservatory Canada or The Royal Conservatory of Music programs. However, these credits cannot be included among the 30 credits required for high school graduation.

### **Cadets:**

Participation in the Cadet program allows you to acquire a maximum of two credits. However, these credits cannot be included among the 30 credits required for high school graduation. They would count towards earning Distinction.

See the Guidance Department if you feel you may qualify for any of these credits.  
Specific documentation will be required.

Special language exams are written in Fall and Spring through the Winnipeg School Division.

# Credits for Employment

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If you have earned a Career Development course credit, which is taken in Grade 9 at PCI, then you have successfully unlocked future credit options once you turn 16.

- Earn while you learn

- Earn up to 2 credits towards high school graduation

- 110 hours of employment equals a high school credit

- Hours can be earned outside of the school day

To register to earn Credits For Employment, connect with Mr. Green. His office is in the East Building.

# High School Apprenticeship Program

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- Opportunity to earn while you learn
- Receive up to 8 credits towards high school graduation
- All credits are at the Grade 12 level
- Also earn “real-deal” apprenticeship hours towards a certified trade
- Flexible - Hours can be earned outside of the school day

## Basic Criteria:

- Minimum of 16 years of age to participate
- Employment in a recognized trade (more than 50 possibilities)

# Community Career Credits:

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## **PCI/Red River College Health Care Aide Partnership**

This course, offered second semester to graduating Grade 12 students, allows students to gain valuable experience in the field of health care. Students attend Red River College where they not only receive Health Care Aide training, but also get to apply their learning in a work experience practicum. Students earn five 40S credits towards high school graduation as well as Health Care Aide Certification.


## **Indigenous Health High School Internship Program**

This program allows Indigenous students an opportunity to gain experience in the field of health care. During Phase 1, students earn a ½ High School Internship Program credit. During Phase 2, students earn summer employment and 2 CFE credits. This program runs during second semester.

# Volunteer Credit

Volunteering in our community can help you earn a high school credit toward graduation:

---

One volunteer credit can be earned during your time in high school & students have the option of working towards a half or full credit.

Students must register and be approved by Ms Bousquet in the Career Centre **prior** to starting the credit at PCI.

The volunteer credit must have a supervisor that can sign for the hours.

The hours can begin at any point in the school year and can carry over to other years in school.

55 hours =  $\frac{1}{2}$  credit

110 hours = full credit

---

One culture credit can be earned during your time in high school & students have the option of working towards a half or full credit.

Students must register and be approved by Ms Bousquet at the Career Centre **prior** to starting the culture credit at PCI.


The culture credit must have a supervisor that can sign for the hours.

Even if you are not sure if you will go on to college or university, you should take time to reflect now on possible career choices for your future.

Many courses have pre-requisites. These pre-requisite courses require planning!
