Grade 12 Graduation vs. Post-Secondary vs. Honour Roll Requirements vs. Entrance Scholarship Requirements

- ▶ **Grad Requirements in Manitoba:** English 40S, Math 40S, Phys. Ed 40F and 2 other 40S courses
- ▶ **Post-Secondary Requirements:** English 40S, Math 40S, Phys. Ed 40F and 3 other 40S courses (excluding Vocational Courses)
- ▶ **Honour Roll Requirements:** English 40S, Math 40S, Phys. Ed 40F and 4 other 40S courses. Note: MAP40S can count for Math 40S and one other 40S course.
- ▶ **Entrance Scholarships:** Post-secondary requirements plus specific eligible courses

Note: See Ms Bousquet ASAP in the Career Centre to check these requirements

Honour Roll Requirements

Students who have maintained an 80% average will be named to the school's honour roll. Students who are named to the honour roll will also receive honours cords to wear at grad.

The awards average is calculated as follows:

Grade	Core Subjects	# of Best Electives
12	3 core courses (Eng., Math, P.E.)	4 best electives (Gr. 12 level, taken any year)

Note: Grade 12 Pre-Cal can count twice, as Math + one elective

Grad Gown Measurements & Ceremony Script

Students will be required to submit their height so that the grad gown that is ordered, fits properly.

As well, students will be asked to submit a “ceremony script” which will be read when students receive their diploma on stage. (They will have a chance to review the script in June and make changes if needed).

Students will receive notification to submit this information using the forms posted on the Grade 12 Google Classroom later this week.

The GRAD RAFFLE is the MAIN FUNDRAISER for GRAD

Donations for prizes will be up to graduates and their parents. Businesses responsible for donating the top 3 prizes valued at approx. \$200-\$500 will be acknowledged and printed on the raffle ticket. If a business wants to be acknowledged on the ticket, the prize must be at PCI by Thursday February 29th.

Students and their families are responsible for obtaining donations and bringing prizes to the school by February 29th. (This is not an absolute deadline, if prizes are brought in after this date, they will still be included.)

Safe Grad - Mr. McKenzie

SAFE GRAD is a plan to organize an enjoyable but accident and incident free graduation celebration. The purpose of a SAFE GRAD program is to eliminate accidents, death and misfortune by promoting safe practices among young persons so as not to experience difficulty with alcohol and drugs. That safe celebration, known as SAFE GRAD, is now widely accepted and is an integral part of graduation in nearly all Manitoba high schools. SAFE GRAD requires parent volunteers to plan and run the event so we will be getting parents to sign up to volunteer at the conclusion of this meeting. Safe Grad is not run by the school, as it is an alcohol event, and for liability purposes, the school cannot be involved in any way. This is why it is completely organized and run by parents.
