Manitoba Student Aid (MSA)

MSA assist in offsetting the immediate costs of post-secondary education by:

- Providing funding through grants, bursaries and interest free loans
- Grants and bursaries do not need to be repaid
- No payments on loan portion while studying fulltime
- VERY flexible repayment terms when finished post-secondary

Manitoba Student Aid (MSA) con't

- Funding is based on a student's individual circumstances AND their course load
 - Two different funding options available: Part-Time and Full-Time
 - Funding formula:

Education + Living Costs – Student/Parent Contributions, Income & Assets

• Receiving funding through MSA does impact the flexibility a student has to add/drop courses outside the add/drop period

Manitoba Student Aid (MSA) con't

- Application for Fall and Winter studies typically opens in June/July
- Students who are relying on MSA funding to cover their tuition should apply as early as possible before classes start but **students can apply after the term has started**
- Students need to monitor their MSA Online Account (MySAO) to ensure all documentation is provided. Outstanding documentation will delay their funding.
- Students will also need to create an account on the National Student Loan Service Centre's (NSLSC) website so they can sign their Master Student Financial Aid Agreement (MSFAA)
- There is an option to contact the post-secondary where you are applying to get more help with this, if needed

BURSARIES FOR POSTSECONDARY STUDIES IN FRENCH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE

HOW TO SUBMIT AN APPLICATION

- Interested students must submit an application directly to the colleges, universities and university faculties participating in the FSL Bursary Program.
- These institutions will be in charge of assessing student applications and awarding bursaries.
- The ACUFC will not be accepting submissions directly from students.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- This yearly program was established by the Government of Canada. Its aim is to encourage young English-speaking students to pursue their postsecondary studies in French. The objective is simple: Allow a greater number of English-speaking Canadians to become bilingual.
- To receive a bursary for postsecondary studies in French as a second language, one must:
- Be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident of Canada;
- Have English as the first official language spoken;
- Study full time in a Canadian institution during the current year;
- Have completed their secondary school studies in an English-language institution and graduated from this institution;
- Be enrolled in the first year of a postsecondary study program in French;
- Be at least 17 years old on the first day of class;
- Demonstrate that they have sufficient knowledge of French to be able to study in that language;
- Intend to pursue full-time studies in a college or undergraduate university program in Canada, to take at least 50% of their courses and participate in related activities (placements and training activities in the community) in French.

MANITOBA BEEF PRODUCERS
