
Downloading the App:

- Log in with your parent account by entering your username (the email address you provided to your child's school) and password.



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
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New User or Forgot Password?

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

Dear Portage la Prairie School Division Families,

On August 15, 2024, Manitoba Education and Early Childhood Learning Minister Nello Altomare directed all Manitoba School Divisions to review and revise their technology policies to include clear guidelines for cell phone use in Kindergarten to Grade 12 schools.

In accordance with this directive and our responsibility to foster safe, caring, respectful, and inclusive schools, the Portage la Prairie School Division will implement consistent use expectations across all our schools. We recognize that there may be exceptional circumstances requiring accommodations. Administration may approve an exemption for a student with a medical (URIS) and/or student-specific learning plan. If students bring a PMD to support their plan/learning, they must follow the protocols outlined at their school. Please contact the school if you have questions regarding planning for your child.

Personal Mobile Devices (PMD): Personal Mobile Devices may include, but are not limited to, any piece of lightweight electronically powered equipment. These devices are typically consumer electronics capable of communications, data processing and/or utility. Examples range from hand-held lightweight electronic devices such as tablets, e-readers and smartphones to small devices such as MP3 players, smart watches and electronic toys.

Student PMD Use

In the Portage la Prairie School Division, we aim to cultivate an optimal learning environment that minimizes distractions and promotes focused engagement in all school activities. By restricting the use of devices during school hours, we seek to foster a culture of connection, attentiveness, active participation, and respectful interaction among students and teachers. This aligns with our commitment to prioritizing educational excellence and ensuring the well-being of our students.

Grades 9 to 12

- Students may not use their PMD during class unless directed by the teacher for educational purposes.
- Students may use their PMDs in the hallways during scheduled breaks.

We understand that these directives may represent a shift in practice. Schools will communicate with students on an ongoing basis to clarify expectations and offer support. We remain committed to educating students regarding the responsible use of technology and digital citizenship.

PCI Sources of Strength (SOS)

Sources of Strength (SOS) is a strength-based suicide prevention program that attempts to have a diverse group of peer leaders positively impact a wide range of cliques within a school or community. Staff will be asked to nominate a diverse group of students that they feel will fit this role. While suicide prevention is a significant part of the training program, the training will focus on strengths and fun activities. Students are usually extremely positive about the training, stating it was "not what I expected," "interesting," "fun," and "empowering."

<u>The Sources of Strength Mission</u> is to provide the highest quality prevention for suicide, violence, and substance abuse by training, supporting and empowering both peer leaders and caring adults to impact their friendship networks and by using rigorous testing to maximize health and protection in the real world.

<u>The Sources of Strength Vision</u> is to lead in the field of suicide prevention by respecting differences in individuals, communities and cultures and by drawing out stories of strength and healing. Many strengths are more powerful than one, and our united goal is to activate and mobilize these

strengths in ways that positively change individuals and communities.

Any students interested in joining Sources of Strength, please see the grade level guidance counsellor. There are some criteria that students need to meet in order to participate fully in the program, but everyone is welcome to talk to a guidance counsellor about the possibility of joining the PCI SOS Peers.



PBIS is an approach that schools can use to improve school safety and promote positive behaviour. At it's heart, PBIS calls on schools to teach kids about behavioural expectations and directly teach social emotional skills just as they would teach any other subject.

What has the PCI PBIS Team been working on?

- Creating and working on PBIS action plans
- Collecting and reviewing data to guide planning and decision-making
- Preparing Behaviour Matrixes— to help sort out expectations around being respectful, being safe, and being responsible in various school locations and "hot spots"
- Creating "Caught Ya!" tickets and planning prize options
- Planning classroom lesson plans with videos, games and PowerPoints
- Planning staff PD
- Creating a PBIS Discipline flow chart for staff to follow
- Creating clear definitions of problem behaviours



Positive Behaviour Interventions & Supports

How Can Parents Help?

- Review PCI PBIS with your student and encourage them to follow it in your
- Ask your student about their day at school.
- Make sure your student is ready to put forth their best effort everyday.
- Ensure a good night's sleep, and have breakfast/lunch/snacks planned for school.
- Help your students arrive on time and attend school regularly.
- Provide a quiet time and space for your child to do homework.
- Practice Positive phrases with your student such as thank you, excuse me, please, and I'm sorry.
- Connect yourself with our school whenever possible. You are always welcome.

PBIS BASICS

What does PBIS do for students?

Teaches them appropriate behaviours

- Lessons throughout the year, reteaching opportunities

Recognizes and praises their positive behaviours - Rewards, opportunities to participate in special events, school swag, etc.

Creates consistency amongst the school environment

Creates a fun, positive atmosphere!

What does PBIS do for staff?

Reduces problem behaviours (Office discipline referrals, suspensions)

Increases instructional time

Improves student engagement

Assists classroom management skills

Improves school culture

How does PBIS work?

Students follow the same expectations at PCI.

These will be posted throughout the school.

When students follow the expectations, they are acknowledged.

When students do not follow the expectations, there are planned responses to help them get back on track.

Everyone is on the same team!

PCI PBIS

Be Respectful

Provide your name to staff when asked.

Listen to adults at first request. Use school appropriate language

Be Safe

Use school appropriate behaviour.
Keep hoods down.
Listen to adults at first request.

Be Responsible

Actively participate in school and lessons.

Attend Class on time with supplies.

Use hallways for transition only. Build positive relationships.



During the school year there are situations that arise that require schools to limit access to the buildings. As part of a review of the Portage la Prairie School Division's Emergency Response Plan, all schools will have 3 selections to limit access if needed.

Sheltering in Place

Sheltering in Place is defined as actions taken when personal safety is considered to be in danger if anyone leaves the school (mainly environmental or weather- related events). All exterior windows and doors may be closed and locked depending on the situation. There is regular movement throughout the school.

Situations that may require a Sheltering in Place Response may include:

- Weather events such as a sudden blizzard
- Environmental event such as a chemical spill exterior to the school
- Missing child
- Dangerous wild animal (cougar, bear, pack of dogs etc.)

Hold & Secure

A **Hold and Secure** is defined as actions taken to control access to and within the school in response to a safety concern both external and internal to the school. All interior and exterior doors are locked and monitored. Classes continue to function normal, there should be limited movement in the hallways and there will be no class changes until notified. Students should be monitored when leaving the classroom to go to the washroom. At this time, unless cases of emergency, students should not be sent to the office. Blinds should be closed in case the matter turns into a lockdown. situation.

Situations that may require Hold & Secure Response may include:

- Altercation involving students/community members
- Threat to safety
- Custody dispute
- Police action in the community
- Chemical release in the community
- Medical emergency (to keep area clear)
- Police apprehension on school property

Lockdown

A Lockdown is defined as actions taken to conceal students and staff in a secure location in response to a threat of violence inside or in relation to the school.

School Lockdown – means the restriction of movement of students and staff due to a threat of violence within or in relation to the school. During a lockdown, exercise critical judgement to maximize safety.

Active-Threat – means one or more individuals who seek out an environment that offers multiple potential victims at risk of death or grievous bodily harm not easily to escape threat.

Situations that may require a Lockdown Response could include:

- Unauthorized visitor with an unknown intent.
- A violent or potentially violent incident inside the school
- Dangerous intruder
- Active shooter
- Barricaded suspect
- Dangerous activity in the community that requires RCMP action.

All About Vaccines


What are vaccines?

Vaccines are safe tools that work with the body's natural defenses (the immune system) to develop protection against diseases— without the risk that comes from getting the disease

Why is vaccination important?

Vaccination is considered one of our most important public health tools. Over the past 50 years, vaccination has saved many lives in Canada and around the world. Some diseases that were once common in Canada are now rare because of vaccines. Vaccination can even completely stop an infectious disease from occurring anywhere in the world.

The more contagious a disease is the more people need to be vaccinated to prevent it from spreading. Diseases can spread vaccinated to prevent are not vaccinated. Vaccination very quickly when people are not vaccinated. rates have to stay high to prevent outbreaks.
